

The Saraland City Council convened in special session on October 4, 2021, at the Saraland Municipal Annex meeting room. The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by Council President Joseph McDonald. Roll call was as follows:

Councilmember Hudson opened the meeting with prayer.

Council President McDonald advised the purpose of this meeting is to open bids for the "Proposals for Residential Solid Waste Collection." Other municipal business may be considered at this time.

Motion was made by Councilmember Biggs, seconded by Councilmember Hudson, to open bids. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Councilmember Hudson, seconded by Councilmember Biggs, to authorize the City Attorney to review the bids and submit a recommendation to the mayor. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Councilmember Biggs, seconded by Councilmember Moye, to adopt a resolution declaring necessary emergency repair to address a matter affecting public health,

safety and convenience concerning the storm water drainage system in and around Scott Drive.  
Motion carried.

**RESOLUTION 2215**

**A RESOLUTION DECLARING NECESSARY EMERGENCY REPAIR  
TO ADDRESS A MATTER AFFECTING PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY  
AND CONVENIENCE CONCERNING THE STORM WATER  
DRAINAGE SYSTEM IN AND AROUND SCOTT DRIVE**

WHEREAS, the City of Saraland maintains a storm water collection system and public roadways within certain areas of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City maintains a storm water collection system in and around the Shelton Beach Estates which, in tandem with roadways servicing the Subdivision, includes two (2) sets of bridges that span portions of the storm water drainage system; and

WHEREAS, on August 29, 2021, Hurricane Ida struck the northern Gulf Coast, resulting in significant wind and torrential rains which impacted Saraland and, more specifically, impacted the bridging system and the drainage system immediately adjacent to the bridges in the Shelton Beach Estates Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the City incurred costs to perform emergency repairs on bridge structures within the Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, as part of the repair efforts, workers on the Project have discovered subsidence issues caused by the heavy storm water flows as a result of Hurricane Ida and related rain events; and

WHEREAS, these issues of subsidence and the subsidence impact on the storm water system and adjacent roadways and bridges impact the public health, safety and convenience of the residents of the Shelton Beach Estates Subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has inspected the affected areas and has determined that there is an immediate need to address this storm related damage; and

WHEREAS, it is the determination of the City Engineer that the issues can be addressed by the Contractor currently completing repairs on the bridge structures damaged by Hurricane Ida storm water; and

WHEREAS, the storm water collection system and adjacent roadways are “public works” as the term is defined under Alabama Code 39-2-2(b), and thus competitive bidding

is not required for contracts not exceeding \$50,000.00; and

WHEREAS, alternatively, it is the opinion of the City Council that an emergency exists as contemplated by Alabama Code §41-16-53 and that it is necessary to secure an appropriate company to address the emergency so that the condition may be addressed immediately; and

WHEREAS, the City will incur emergency expenses to stabilize the relevant portions of the storm water collection system and adjoining bridges and roadbeds in an effort to stop adverse impact upon the road and bridge system, as well as the storm water collection system; and

WHEREAS, the City has agreed to hire JAMES H. ADAMS & SON CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC. to address the necessary repairs and correct the emergency condition in an amount of payment not to exceed \$45,000.00.


THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Saraland City Council that the condition of the storm water collection system and roadway in the areas described above is an emergency affecting the public health, safety and convenience of the citizens of Saraland as the term is contemplated in Alabama Code §41-16-53, and further that this matter concerns "public works" as the term is defined in Alabama Code §39-2-2(b). As such, the Mayor is authorized to hire JAMES H. ADAMS & SON CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, INC. to undertake the necessary repairs for an amount not to exceed Forty-Five Thousand And No/100th (\$45,000.00) Dollars.

ADOPTED this 4<sup>th</sup> day of October 2021.

Motion was made by Councilmember Biggs to adjourn.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting adjourned at 6:55 p.m.
